NOTICES OF MOTION

1. Mr M K Sayed moved: That the House notes and discusses the dilapidated state of school infrastructure and the infrastructure backlog in the province; notes further that, while many schools have been closed down in the past due to poor infrastructure, many more schools are dilapidated due to poor maintenance; and calls for a full investigation into (i) the state of school infrastructure, (ii) the demand for school infrastructure and (iii) the maintenance plans of the Department.
2. Mr A P van der Westhuizen moved: That the House debates the progress made with the construction related to the raising of the Clanwilliam Dam wall, the challenges and delays experienced to date, and the benefits that the increased water storage capacity may hold for agriculture, particularly for emerging farmers, in the lower Olifants River area.
3. Mr P Marran moved: That the House debates ways to transform the agricultural economy in the Western Cape.

4. Mr D Smith moved: That the House debates the high cost of water and electricity in the province.
5. Mr M K Sayed moved: That the House notes with concern that parents of learners who attend the Diaz Primary School in Mossel Bay are not happy with WCED's plans for a replacement school, which will not be big enough to accommodate Grade R learners as plans for two classes were not approved and which may also lead to the loss of jobs by two teachers; notes further concerns that Grade R learners will have to be moved to other schools as they no longer have place at the school; condemns the WCED's inconsiderate approach; and calls for a further investigation into the matter.
6. Mr D Smith moved: That the House notes with concern that Melissa Whitehead, the City of Cape Town suspended Director of Transport, who was found guilty at a disciplinary hearing, resigned yesterday afternoon; notes further that the Bowman Gilfillan investigation identified her as one of the enablers of corruption, which related to the appointment of UK consultants to set up the Transport Authority, at the City of Cape Town; acknowledges that, while Whitehead may have resigned, there remains a need for further independent investigation into deep-rooted corruption at the City of Cape Town; and calls for an investigation into corruption at the City of Cape Town.
7. Mr D Smith moved: That the House notes and congratulates the ANC on its resounding victory in the ward 95 by-election where it received 76% of the vote, while the likes of DA only received 5% support; notes further that these results show that people in poor communities still view the ANC as the only party that can free them from poverty; and also congratulates newly elected Councillor Xolisa Ngwekazi.
8. Mr L L Mvimbi moved: That the House notes that, while the DA may have retained ward 5 in the by-election in Knysna, its majority decreased owing to the performance of the newly formed parties, PBI and KIM, that took away more than a thousand votes from the DA; notes further that these are signs that the DA is starting to disintegrate in the province; and welcomes the outcome.
9. Ms P Z Lekker moved: That the House notes that the ANC's National Executive Committee (NEC), in its quest for rebuilding, renewal and unity, took a decision to appoint an Provincial Interim Committee (PIC) that is led by comrades Lerumo Kalako and RONALDA NAMULENGU, together with other members in this House; notes further and congratulates Members Rachel Windvogel, Ayanda Bans, Andile Lili, Nomi Nkondlo and Cameron Dugmore, Leader of Opposition, on their appointment to serve on the PIC; and wishes the ANC well as it seeks to rebuild a stronger organisation ready to take back municipalities in 2021 and the province in 2024.
