1. Opening and welcome

The Chairperson, Mr B Kivedo opened the meeting and welcomed the Members of the Standing Committee, Departmental officials and members of public.

2. Briefing by the Department of Social Development, the Department of Community Safety, the City of Cape Town and the Western Cape Education Department on the submission received from Mr M Mbiko on Safety and Security initiative at schools in Nyanga.

The Committee deliberated on the briefings

The Committee RESOLVED that the stakeholders provide the following information:-

- 2.1. The Department of Social Development provides a written feedback on the assessment centres which assist street children in bringing them back into the mainstream and reunifying them with their families.
- 2.2. The Department of Social Development provides the statistics on the number of "street children" that were referred from Nyanga Police Station to Kensington residential rehabilitation centre.
- 2.3. The City of Cape Town's School Resource Commander to conduct an assessment of Liwa Primary School and all other schools in Nyanga.
- 2.4. The City of Cape Town in consultation with Nyanga Tourism-Platform conduct a risk assessment at each school in Nyanga and to assess what is required to make a positive impact.
- 2.5. The City of Cape Town investigates the dumping site in front of Liwa Primary School, and other schools within Nyanga
- 2.6. The City of Cape Town's Liquor Unit to engage with Nyanga Tourism-Platform and the principals of schools in Nyanga on all policy and operations when on dealing with illegal liquor traders in the area.
- 2.7. The Department of Community Safety to investigate whether the implementation of the walking bus in area would be effective.
- 2.8. The Department of Community Safety investigation whether there is a need for a School Resource Officer at schools within Nyanga.
- 2.9. The Committee further requests that written feedback on the above recommendations be monitored and provided to the Committee by 15 September 2017.
