- 3.2. A plan that would assist learners in dealing with service delivery protests in their area regularly. The WCED is also requested to provide the mitigation risk factors, if any, to ensure that those learners could still be provided with the learning resources to avoid losing school days.
- 3.3. The number of learners that have died due to gang violence. The list should include areas and the names of the schools.
