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1. Introduction

- 1.1 The Conduct Committee, established in terms of the Standing Rules of the Western Cape Provincial Parliament and governed by the Members of the Western Cape Provincial Parliament Code of Conduct Act, 2002 (Act 3 of 2002), is charged with carrying out the functions required of it under the Code of Conduct for Members of the Western Cape Provincial Parliament (25 March 2014).
- 1.2 The Conduct Committee shall:
- 1.2.1 Implement the Code of Conduct;
- 1.2.2 Develop standards of conduct;
- 1.2.3 Regularly review the Code and make recommendations for its amendment;
- 1.2.4 Perform other functions and exercise other powers reasonably assigned to the Committee by the Code and in terms of resolutions adopted; and
- 1.2.5 Report to the House at least annually on its operations and the effectiveness of the Code.

2 Committee Report on its operations and the efficiency of the Code

The Conduct Committee held meetings during 2021 on 26 February 2021, 7 May 2021, 22 June 2021 and 25 August 2021.

The Registrar reported to the Committee that all Members submitted their disclosure forms by the deadline of 30 April 2021.

Three requests for access to the public part of the Register was received by the Registrar.

The Committee, during the period under review, dealt with an alleged breach of the code, case EOW. The Committee presented its report on case EOW to the House on 2 September 2021.

The proposed amendments to the Code of Conduct (English version) was adopted to by the House on 3 December 2020. The Code of Conduct for Members of the Western Cape Provincial Parliament, 2020, was signed by Speaker Masizole Mnqasela, on 8 March 2021 and 1 April 2021 was determined to be the date for implementation of the Code.

3. Financial particulars

The Conduct Committee is part of a group of committees with a shared budget. As at the end of November 2021 the total expenditure attributed to the activities of the Committee amounted to R0,00.
