COMMITTEE REPORTS

1. (*Final mandate stage*) Report of the Standing Committee on the Premier and Constitutional Matters on the Traditional Courts Bill [B 1D–2017] (section 76), dated 13 November 2020, as follows:

The Standing Committee on the Premier and Constitutional Matters, having considered the subject of the Traditional Courts Bill [B 1D–2017] (section 76) referred to the Committee in accordance with Standing Rule 217, recommends that the House confers on the Western Cape's delegation in the National Council of Provinces the authority not to support the Bill.

Minority view

In accordance with Standing Rule 90 the African National Congress expressed its minority view to support the Bill.

Report to be considered.

2. (*Final mandate stage*) Report of the Standing Committee on Local Government on the Local Government: Municipal Structures Amendment Bill [B 19D–2018] (NCOP), dated 13 November 2020.

The *Standing* Committee on Local Government, having considered the subject of the Local Government: Municipal Structures Amendment Bill [B 19D–2018] (NCOP) referred to it in accordance with Standing Rule 217, recommends that the House confers on the Western Cape's delegation in the National Council of Provinces the authority to support the Bill.

3. Report of the Standing Committee on Community Safety, Cultural Affairs and Sport on the recommendation for appointment of candidates to the Governing Board of the Western Cape Liquor Authority, dated 12 November 2020, as follows:
 1. The Governing Board of the Western Cape Liquor Authority (the Board) required two new members due to vacancies on the Board.
 2. The Board comprises seven members.
 3. Section 3(3) of the Western Cape Liquor Act, 2008 (Act 4 of 2008), stipulates that “(t)he relevant standing committee of the Provincial Parliament must make the recommendations referred to in subsection (1) after evaluating all candidates as to their suitability for appointment”.
 4. The Committee, having received a list of candidates from the Minister of Community Safety, proceeded to interview all of the 17 eligible candidates on 12 November 2020.
 5. Two candidates withdrew their nominations and declined interviews.
 6. The Committee resolved to recommend that Dr L Mdunyelwa and Mr AH le Roux be considered for appointment to the Governing Board of the Western Cape Liquor Authority.
