1. The House met at 10:00.
2. The Speaker took the Chair and read the prayer.
3. [10:01] The Speaker announced that, due to the cessation of party membership of Mr D G Jacobs, a vacancy occurred in the representation of the National Coloured Congress in the Western Cape Provincial Parliament. This vacancy has been filled by the nomination of Mr J R Michels with effect from 17 October 2025. The Member had taken the oath in the Speaker's office on 17 October 2025.
4. [10:02] The Speaker made a general announcement regarding the sitting of the Western Cape Provincial Parliament in accordance with Rule 1A of the Standing Rules pertaining to Members in remote attendance by electronic means.
5. [10:04] The Chief Whip of the Majority Party (Mr G Bosman) moved: That, notwithstanding the provision of Rule 18, the hours of sitting on Thursday, 13 November 2025, shall be from 10:00 to adjournment.

Agreed to.

6. [10:05] The Chief Whip of the Majority Party (Mr G Bosman) moved: That Mr Kobus Marais be appointed in terms of section 4(k) of the Castle Management Act, 1993, as the representative of the provincial legislature for the Western Cape to serve on the Castle Control Board.

Agreed to.

7. [10:06] Ms W F Kaizer-Philander moved: That the House, in accordance with Rule 119(1) of the Standing Rules, establishes an Ad-hoc Committee on Child Protection Reform to consider and develop legislative and policy proposals aimed at strengthening child protection and safety in the Western Cape, including reviewing the implementation gaps, legal frameworks and institutional arrangements identified in the Standing Committee on Social Development's Child Protection Multi-Stakeholder Engagement Report tabled in the House on 2 September 2025 (ATC 88 of 2025).

The Committee shall, within its mandate, consult with relevant departments, organs of state, civil society organisations and experts to identify areas where provincial legislation, policy alignment or intergovernmental mechanisms may be improved to enhance the protection and well-being of children.

The Committee shall consist of 11 Members, appointed in accordance with Rule 120 of the Standing Rules, with membership allocated as follows:

Democratic Alliance – 6 Members

African National Congress – 1 Member

Patriotic Alliance – 1 Member

Economic Freedom Fighters – 1 Member

Smaller parties (National Coloured Congress, Freedom Front Plus, Al Jama-ah, African Christian Democratic Party and GOOD) – 2 Members

The Committee must report regularly to the House on its progress and submit a final report containing findings and legislative recommendations upon the conclusion of its work.

The names of the Members representing the aforementioned political parties must be submitted to the Speaker of the Western Cape Provincial Parliament as soon as possible for publication in the Announcements, Tablings and Committee Reports (ATC).

Ms A P Bans moved without notice: That the House notes with deep sorrow the passing away of Narriman Gadija Bazier Samuels, affectionately known as “Ma G”, who passed away on Saturday 1 November 2025 after a courageous battle with heart and chest ailments at the age of 60; notes that Ma G was a beloved community activist, mother, grandmother, and elder who dedicated her life to serving the people of Mitchells Plain; notes that her tireless activism, compassion and selfless spirit touched the lives of countless residents and made her a pillar of strength and hope in her community; recognises her remarkable contribution to community development through her leadership in various initiatives, including the Walking Bus Project, the Mitchells Plain Crisis Forum (MPCF), the Freedom Park Neighbourhood Watch and the Community in Blue initiative; notes that, even in the face of illness, Ma G remained deeply committed to her calling, often saying, “my people need me”, a testament to her unwavering sense of duty and love for her community; pays tribute to her strength, compassion and lifelong dedication to improving safety and unity in Mitchells Plain; notes that her nurturing leadership inspired and mobilised many, and her passing away leaves an irreplaceable void in the hearts of those who knew her; and expresses deepest condolences to her family and to the Mitchells Plain community.

19. Mr M K Sayed moved without notice: That the House notes and congratulates Westridge teenager Triston Fortune, a Grade 10 learner at the Bergvliet High School, on his appointment as the Western Cape Child Ambassador and Deputy President of the Nelson Mandela Children’s Parliament; notes that Triston’s achievement is a source of great pride for his school, community and the province as a whole, as it highlights the leadership potential and civic mindedness of young people from Mitchells Plain; recognises Triston’s remarkable journey as a young leader who has consistently demonstrated a passion for advocacy and youth empowerment; notes that his leadership roles include serving as a member of the Junior City Council and as Chairperson of his school’s Representative Council of Learners (RCL), where he has shown commitment to representing the voices of his peers and promoting learner engagement in governance and education matters; commends Triston for viewing his new ambassadorship “not as a title, but as a responsibility” and for his vision to represent every child in the Western Cape and across South Africa; notes that his advocacy priorities, education equality, mental health awareness and the fight against hunger reflect a deep understanding of the challenges facing children today and a desire to contribute meaningfully to their resolution; and notes that Triston’s achievement stands as an inspiration to young people across the province, reminding us that age is no barrier to leadership and that the future of our nation is indeed in capable and compassionate hands.

Mr M K Sayed moved without notice: That the House notes and congratulates Moied Baleg, a Grade 12 learner at the Settlers High School in the Western Cape, for his remarkable achievement as the overall winner of the Old Mutual South African Mathematics Olympiad (SAMO); notes that Moied, selected from more than 115 of the country’s top Grade 10 to

Grade 12 contestants, distinguished himself through his exceptional mathematical talent and perseverance, earning the prestigious gold Dirk van Rooy medal; notes that his outstanding performance is a source of tremendous pride not only for his school and family, but also for the broader Western Cape and the nation; notes that Moied's success demonstrates the power of hard work, strong mentorship and the vital role that dedicated educators and institutions play in nurturing young mathematical minds; and salutes his achievement and wishes him every success as he continues his academic journey.

21. Mr B N Ngqentsu moved without notice: That the House notes with deep sadness the tragic passing away of Mr Mzukisi Zwakala, a taxi owner who was brutally gunned down in Lwandle; notes that Mr Zwakala was found inside his vehicle with multiple gunshot wounds to his head and body, in an attack that also left two other people wounded, including a woman; notes that his untimely death has sent shockwaves through the local community and the broader taxi industry, once again highlighting the devastating toll of the ongoing violence in the sector; conveys heartfelt condolences to Mr Zwakala's family, friends and colleagues, and acknowledges the profound loss suffered by all who knew him; and further condemns the senseless acts of violence that continue to plague the taxi industry, undermining livelihoods and endangering the lives of both operators and commuters.

Mr B N Ngqentsu moved without notice: That the House notes and extends heartfelt congratulations to Loukmaan Adams, Dr Isaac Balie, Thandi Swartbooi, Joline Young, Nkosikho Juqu, Marco Olivier, Charmain Plummer, Eleanor Damon, Mxolisi Patrick Holo Mtshamba and Fanie Jason on their well-deserved recognition at the 2025 Western Cape Cultural Awards; notes that their outstanding contributions, from Loukmaan Adams's musical innovation, Dr Balie's lifelong dedication to heritage, and Thandi Swartbooi's tireless work in preserving indigenous dance and music, through to the pioneering preservation efforts, community empowerment and creative excellence represented by all the awardees, truly enrich our province and its cultural heritage; celebrates the broader cohort of winners – honoured across diverse fields including the arts, culture, language, heritage, libraries, museums and archives – as individuals who, through their creativity and commitment, reflect the vibrant spirit of our collective journey “from darkness into light”; and notes that their achievements affirm that culture is not just a reflection of our society, but its beating heart that inspires us all to continue nurturing its growth for future generations.

Mr B N Ngqentsu moved without notice: That the House notes and congratulates Lelethu Jikela from Khayelitsha on his outstanding achievement after being named the winner in the category Community Development at the Forty Under 40 South Africa awards; notes that his recognition is a powerful affirmation of more than 15 years of dedicated work through the Jikela Studios, using music, culture and mentorship to uplift the youth, women and people with disabilities in underresourced communities; notes that Lelethu's journey, from local stages to national acclaim, not only celebrates his personal commitment, but also highlights the transformative power of creativity rooted in community; commends his visionary leadership and ambition, including his goal to establish a music school in Khaye-

litsha; and wishes him continued success as he builds sustainable opportunities for young creatives and helps to reshape the cultural economy in our country.

24. Ms P Z Lekker moved without notice: That the House notes and congratulates Mr Dan Marokane, Group Chief Executive of Eskom Holdings SOC Ltd, on being named the 2025 Sunday Times Business Leader of the Year, one of South Africa's most distinguished honours in corporate leadership; notes that this recognition celebrates his visionary stewardship and steadfast commitment to Eskom's renewal, marked by progress in restoring energy security, rebuilding public trust and steering the organisation toward long-term sustainability; notes that Mr Marokane's leadership embodies resilience, integrity and collective purpose, qualities that continue to inspire confidence in Eskom's turnaround journey; notes that his decision to dedicate the award to every Eskom employee underscores his inclusive and transformative leadership style; applauds Mr Marokane's outstanding achievement; and wishes him continued success as he leads efforts to redefine Eskom for a better and brighter future for all South Africans.

25. Ms B M van Minnen moved without notice: That the House expresses its profound condolences after the passing away of Mr Alfred Rietmann, a creative and resilient artist, a much-respected mentor and a brilliant theatre practitioner at Artscape; notes that Mr Rietmann's contribution to the performing arts community in the Western Cape has left an enduring legacy of excellence and inspiration; notes that his work uplifted countless young artists and enriched the cultural life of our province; and extends deepest sympathy to his family, friends and colleagues. May his remarkable spirit rest in peace.

26. Ms B M van Minnen moved without notice: That the House notes that on Saturday 25 October 2025 the Helderberg Stroke Support Group (HSSG) hosted its Stroke Awareness Summit in Somerset West, in partnership with the Busamed Paardevlei Private Hospital, to tackle one of South Africa's leading causes of disability; further notes that the event was held at the hospital's new mental-wellness facility, Thrive, in anticipation of World Stroke Day on 29 October; acknowledges the HSSG's contribution over the past 40 years in building a network of support for stroke-affected individuals in the Helderberg region, focusing on prevention, education and rehabilitation programmes; and commends the HSSG, its partners and volunteers for their continued commitment to improving community health and stroke awareness.

27. Mr P Johnson moved without notice: That the House congratulates the Swartland Community Cadet Squad, led by President Chantal Snell, for their outstanding performance at the South African School Band Association National Championships held in Durban; notes that the 20-member community-based squad represented both Swartland and the Western Cape with pride, earning a Gold Certificate for Best Community Band despite competing against larger and better-resourced schools; further notes their dedication in raising their own funds and travelling over 1 600 km to participate; and commends the cadets for exemplifying the values of teamwork, discipline and perseverance, while continuing to inspire the local youth through music and community involvement.

28. Mr N P Masipa moved without notice: That the House congratulates the ten Nyanga youths who successfully completed the Thrive somatic intervention training programme, becoming the first cohort of “Thrive initiators” dedicated to tackling bullying and violence in their schools and communities; notes that this programme equips young people with vital tools in self-awareness, emotional intelligence and communication, thereby empowering them to lead with empathy and transform conflict into understanding; acknowledges that these young leaders are setting a powerful example in Nyanga – showing that meaningful change begins within – and that healing, respect and leadership can grow from the heart of the community itself; commends Thrive and its founder, Brian Segal, for investing in youth-driven transformation and for helping to build safer, stronger and more resilient communities across the Western Cape.

29. Ms B M van Minnen moved without notice: That the House congratulates the 1st Somerset West Company Boys’ Brigade on celebrating its 90th anniversary on Sunday 27 October 2025, with a commemorative march through Somerset West; notes that the event also marked the 142nd Founder’s Day of the Boys’ Brigade movement in South Africa, with participation from eight Western Cape units; and commends the Boys’ Brigade for 135 years of youth development and community service in South Africa.

30. Mr P Johnson moved without notice: That the House congratulates the Western Cape learners and teachers who won 14 awards at the 2025 National Skills Competition in Johannesburg; notes that this national event, hosted by the Sasol Foundation and the Kagiso Trust, showcased excellence in technical and vocational education; commends our learners and teachers for their outstanding achievements and Nathan Joseph for his leadership; and acknowledges, during National Teachers’ Month, the dedication of teachers who inspire excellence in our schools.

Agreed to.

31. Ms B M van Minnen moved without notice: That the House congratulates the Helderberg Cricket Club (HCC) on their commanding seven-wicket victory over Kensington Cricket Club in a First Division C clash at the Helderzicht Sports Grounds on Saturday 25 October; notes the team’s brilliant bowling performance, which set up a decisive and well-deserved win; and commends the players, coaches and management of the HCC for their continued commitment to sporting excellence and community pride.

32. Mr D W Bryant moved without notice: That the House congratulates the Western Cape Government on the launch of its Water Resilience Strategy (2025–2035), a groundbreaking plan to secure the province’s water future through sustainability, innovation and collaboration; further congratulates Minister Anton Bredell, Minister Tertius Simmers and Minister Ivan Meyer for their visionary leadership in developing a strategy that not only protects vital water resources, but also supports economic growth, job creation and community well-being; notes that the plan sets ambitious goals to expand water supply, improve efficiency and ensure all municipalities have diversified and sustainable water sources; and commends the Western Cape Government for taking proactive steps to build

resilience against droughts and floods, to safeguard agriculture and to ensure every resident has access to clean and reliable water for generations to come.

Agreed to.

33. Mr M Booysen moved without notice: That the House notes the preparation of the Western Cape Department of Health and Wellness for the launch of the National Immunisation Catch-up Drive from 1 to 30 November 2025; further notes that the campaign aims to close the immunity gap caused by missed vaccinations, following a decline in infant immunisation coverage to below the provincial 95% target, which has left many children vulnerable to measles, polio, tuberculosis, diphtheria, whooping cough and tetanus; acknowledges the Department's ongoing response to a measles outbreak in Khayelitsha and its proactive mass immunisation services being provided at schools, preschools and healthcare facilities, as well as contact tracing amid an increase in diphtheria cases in the Cape metropolitan area; and commends the Western Cape Department of Health and Wellness for its continued efforts to protect public health, to improve immunisation coverage and to strengthen herd immunity across the province.

Agreed to.

34. Ms B M van Minnen moved without notice: That the House notes the appointment of Mr Vasili Vass as the Station Manager of Fine Music Radio (FMR) with effect from 1 October 2025; acknowledges Mr Vass's distinguished career in radio and media spanning more than three decades, including his leadership roles at Primedia Broadcasting and e.tv/eNCA, and his instrumental role in the launch of eNCA, South Africa's first independent news channel; further notes his strong academic background in Research Psychology from Rhodes University and his lifelong passion for classical music; and congratulates Mr Vass on his appointment and wishes him and the Fine Music Radio team continued success in promoting South Africa's cultural and musical heritage.

Agreed to.

35. Ms W F Kaizer-Philander moved without notice: That the House congratulates Mr Kenneth Uren on his appointment as the new Principal of the Paulus Joubert Primary School; notes that Mr Uren, a born and bred Paarliet, began his schooling at the Paulus Joubert Primary School in 1974, matriculated at the Paulus Joubert Secondary School, and has served as a dedicated teacher at the school for the past 31 years; and commends Mr Uren for his lifelong commitment to education, his humility and his passion for inspiring learners to live life to the fullest.

Agreed to.

36. Mr D W Bryant moved without notice: That the House congratulates CapeNature and its partners in the Custodians of Rare and Endangered Wildflowers (CREW) on the remarkable rediscovery of the *Erica cunoniensis*, an endangered plant species last seen nearly four decades ago in the Kogelberg Nature Reserve; notes with appreciation the dedication and expertise of CapeNature field staff – particularly Pupil Field Ranger Sylvia Wolita whose sharp eye led to the discovery – and acknowledges the importance of collaboration between scientists and citizen conservationists in protecting biodiversity; recognises that this rediscovery reaffirms the Western Cape's global significance as part of the Cape Floristic Region, a biodiversity hotspot found almost entirely within the province; and commends

CapeNature for its continued leadership in safeguarding our natural heritage and ensuring that even the rarest species are not lost to history.

Agreed to.

37. Mr D W Bryant moved without notice: That the House notes the outcomes of the 2023/24 Local Government Audits, which show that 26 municipalities in the Western Cape received unqualified audits, including 20 that achieved clean audits, as confirmed by the Auditor-General of South Africa; further notes that the municipalities that achieved clean audits include Bergrivier, Breede Valley, Cape Agulhas, Cape Winelands District, City of Cape Town, Drakenstein, Garden Route District, George, Hessequa, Langeberg, Matzikama, Mossel Bay, Overberg District, Overstrand, Saldanha Bay, Stellenbosch, Swartland, Swellendam, West Coast District and Witzenberg; acknowledges the efforts of municipal officials and councillors whose work contributes to maintaining high standards of governance in the province; and recognises that these results reflect the value of effective oversight, financial prudence and responsible management of public resources.

Agreed to.

38. Mr B N Ngqentsu moved without notice: That the House notes with deep outrage and sorrow the brutal killing of an 18-year-old young woman in Delft, who was shot eight times in the head in what police believe to be a targeted act of retaliation; notes that this heinous act occurred in broad daylight and has left the Delft community deeply shaken, highlighting the pervasive and unchecked violence in our townships; further notes that the victim was the daughter of a local tavern owner, who had allegedly refused to pay so-called “protection fees” demanded by criminal syndicates; notes that this murder is emblematic of the growing scourge of extortion networks operating in communities, which use intimidation, threats and violence to enforce compliance, creating an environment of fear that undermines lawful enterprise and public safety; condemns in the strongest terms this barbaric act of violence; calls on the South African Police Service and all relevant law enforcement agencies to intensify their investigations, to ensure the swift apprehension and prosecution of the perpetrators and to dismantle the extortion networks that terrorise communities; and further urges the provincial government to provide support to victims and communities affected by extortion, to implement preventative measures and to ensure that the rule of law is upheld without fear or favour.

Agreed to.

39. Mr B N Ngqentsu moved without notice: That the House commends the swift and decisive action of the South African Police Service in responding to a community alert in Dunoon, which led to the arrest of six armed men found in possession of multiple firearms and ammunition; notes that the police’s rapid response and professionalism undoubtedly prevented a potential tragedy in a community already terrorised by criminal gangs and extortion rackets; notes with deep concern the rise in extortion-related crimes across Cape Town townships, where armed groups intimidate residents and business owners under the guise of “protection fees”; notes that these criminal syndicates have sown fear in communities, destabilised local economies and undermined public safety; notes that the arrest of these six suspects demonstrates the urgent need for continuous intelligence-driven policing and strengthened collaboration between law enforcement and local communities; condemns in the strongest terms the growing influence of extortion syndicates that exploit vulnerable communities through fear and violence; calls upon the SAPS, the Hawks and the

provincial Department of Police Oversight and Community Safety to intensify targeted operations, to increase visible policing in high-risk areas, such as Dunoon, and to ensure that those arrested face swift prosecution and maximum penalties under the law; furthermore urges the provincial government to expand community safety forums and neighbourhood watch programmes, empowering residents to report criminal activities without fear of retribution; and commends the brave residents of Dunoon whose vigilance and courage in reporting suspicious activity played a vital role in preventing possible bloodshed.

Agreed to.

40. Ms P Z Lekker moved without notice: That the House notes the call by Women for Change for a nationwide shutdown on 21 November 2025, aimed at protesting the ongoing scourge of gender-based violence and femicide in South Africa; notes that the movement coincides with the G20 Leaders' Summit and seeks to draw global attention to the daily violence faced by women and LGBTQI+ persons in our country, highlighting a crisis that requires urgent and systemic intervention; recognises that femicide has reached crisis levels, as eight women have been murdered in the province this week alone; notes that the slow pace of justice, coupled with inadequate government response, continues to exacerbate public outrage and fosters a climate of fear in communities; notes that the planned national shutdown reflects the collective demand for urgent action, including the formal declaration of gender-based violence as a national disaster and the mobilisation of resources to tackle this scourge decisively; condemns in the strongest possible terms the brutal and systemic violence inflicted upon women and girls; calls on the national government, the SAPS and the Western Cape Government to intensify their efforts through improved policing, enhanced victim support services, harsher penalties for perpetrators and strengthened partnerships with civil society organisations; further expresses its solidarity with all women, girls and organisations participating in the shutdown; and reaffirms its unwavering support for the fight to end gender-based violence and femicide, both in the Western Cape and across South Africa, recognising that meaningful change requires sustained commitment from all spheres of government and civil society.

Agreed to.

41. Ms P Z Lekker moved without notice: That the House warmly welcomes and commends the recent efforts of the South African Police Service in the Western Cape, resulting in 26 arrests over three days as part of Operation Lockdown III, which targeted gang-related crime in hotspot areas, including Manenberg, Elsies River, Kensington, Wynberg, Lenteguur and Delft; notes that the arrests included charges for possession of unlicensed firearms and ammunition, hijacked vehicles, drug dealing and other gang-related offences, demonstrating the effectiveness of intelligence-driven and coordinated policing in reducing criminal activity and protecting communities; further notes that operations such as Operation Lockdown III are essential to disrupting gang structures, dismantling criminal networks and creating a safer environment for residents; and calls upon the provincial government and the SAPS to sustain high-impact operations in gang hotspots, to ensure successful prosecutions, to maintain visible policing and to strengthen community law enforcement partnerships through tip-offs, neighbourhood watch structures and community policing forums.

Agreed to.

42. Mr M K Sayed moved without notice: That the House, in the spirit of African unity and solidarity, commemorates the 50th anniversary of the independence of the Republic of Angola, declared on 11 November 1975, marking the end of centuries of Portuguese colonial rule; notes that Angola's newly won independence was immediately threatened by foreign interference, including the invasion by the apartheid regime of South Africa, backed by the United States, in support of rebel movements against the legitimate government led by the People's Movement for the Liberation of Angola or MPLA; further notes the heroic act of international solidarity demonstrated by Cuba, which sent tens of thousands of troops to defend Angola's sovereignty, supported by the Soviet Union (Russia) and African liberation movements, including our own in South Africa; recalls that the Battle of Cuito Cuanavale (1987–1988) marked a historic turning point in the struggle for liberation in Southern Africa, a victory that contributed directly to the independence of Namibia and the eventual defeat of apartheid in South Africa; salutes the people of Angola for their courage, resilience and sacrifice in the face of aggression and honours the memory of all those who gave their lives in defence of freedom and self-determination; further recognises that the bonds of solidarity forged in struggle between South Africa, Angola and Cuba remain a cornerstone of progressive internationalism and a testament to the power of unity among oppressed peoples; and therefore calls on this House to celebrate Angola's 50 years of independence and to reaffirm South Africa's commitment to African unity, sovereignty and justice as we continue to strive for a continent free from foreign domination, exploitation and oppression.

Agreed to.

43. Ms R Windvogel moved without notice: That the House notes that the annual campaign of 16 Days of Activism for No Violence Against Women and Children will commence on 25 November, coinciding with the International Day for the Elimination of Violence Against Women; notes that this global campaign, observed in South Africa since 1998, seeks to raise awareness and to galvanise collective action to end the scourge of gender-based violence, which remains one of the most devastating human rights violations in our country; further notes with deep concern that South Africa continues to face unacceptably high rates of gender-based violence and femicide, with women and children, particularly in impoverished and marginalised communities, bearing the brunt of abuse, neglect and systemic failure; notes that the persistence of these crimes represents a moral, social and institutional crisis that undermines the constitutional values of dignity, equality and freedom for all; therefore calls for urgent, coordinated and sustained action across all spheres of government, civil society and the private sector to strengthen prevention, protection and prosecution measures – this includes improving victim support services, ensuring that perpetrators face swift justice, and investing in education and social programmes that challenge the toxic cultures of patriarchy and violence that fuel abuse in our society; and acknowledges and salutes the tireless work of women's rights organisations, community activists, social workers and law enforcement officers who continue to fight for justice and safety for women and children, often under difficult conditions and with limited resources.
