NOTICE OF MOTIONS

1. Mr C M Dugmore moved: That the House establishes a multi-party *ad hoc* committee consisting of 7 members to investigate whether the Premier has deliberately misled this House when claiming on Thursday, 13 November 2014 during an interpellation, that the Provincial Department of Human Settlements had completed the development of a Provincial Housing Strategy as committed to by the Premier in the State of the Province Address on Friday, 20 June 2014 and further to establish whether the conduct of the Premier constitutes a violation of the Oath of Office as assented by her on 21 May 2014.
2. Ms S W Davids moved: That the House debates the growing inequalities and poor conditions of farm workers in the Western Cape under DA rule.

3. Mr D Joseph moved: That the House discusses the audit outcome of the Western Cape Departments and entities for the 2014/15 financial year and steps to be taken to improve on the good records.
4. Ms M N Gillion moved: That the House debates the uneven dealings by DA government leaders with victims of disastrous fires.
5. Mr R T Olivier moved: That the House requests the education department to set up a rapid response team with trained negotiators to react to emergencies, protests and especially abuse by teachers in schools in order to prevent wide scale dissatisfaction and reprisal by communities.
6. Mr R T Olivier moved: That the House condemns all forms of bullying and abuse at schools that lead to various forms of reactions like the recent case where a Montagu learner drank agricultural poison; that the education department is requested to set up a helpline for learners in distress and that this House furthermore sends a message to all schools across the province to discourage such excesses in strong terms.
