(a) Note that the data below excludes March 2025 data - i.e. only 11 months data.

Inpatient days and day patients listed below are a count of the number of days these patients were in hospital.

Please note: To avoid double counting, separations are not included in the total headcount because they have been counted in the day patient and inpatient days.

(b) Major factors that contribute to patients' waiting times include:

- growing population numbers, which put pressure on healthcare facilities, that were already dealing with the high burden of disease;
- higher trauma pressures, including severity and acuity of cases, which result in longer waits for lower-triaged patients.
- an expanding population often comes with a real decrease in budget allocations per capita, placing further strain on resources and extending waiting periods.
